- ☑ If your wisdom teeth give you trouble, you may need to...
 - have them extracted.
 - have them out
- ☑ If plaques are not removed by regular brushing, they may develop into tartar.
- ☑ The living part of the tooth is called the pulp.

- Pay attention to the pronunciation of the following words:

plaque /plɑ:k/ /plæk/

crown /kraʊn/

- It's a bacterial disease.
- This acid creates cavities in the teeth.
- Frequent snacks create a permanent presence of acid.
- The acid will eat into the enamel.
- If the acid eats only into the enamel...
 - the person will not feel any pain.
 - the tooth will not be painful.
- different kinds of cavity types
- The plaque develops into tartar.
 - may develop
- It depends on ...
- Caries will develop faster in the absence of oral hygiene.
 - ... to maintain proper oral hygiene...
- Dental **caries**, also known as tooth decay or cavity, is a disease wherein bacterial processes damage hard tooth structure (enamel, dentin and cementum).



- You can also use a mouthwash after brushing your teeth.
- There is a relation between a person's age and his **susceptibility to caries**.

susceptibility /sə,sep.tɪ'bil.ɪ.ti/ noun [U]
when someone or something is easily influenced, harmed or infected

- The teeth are more resistant to acid in adults than in children.

- Eruption is the process in which the tooth erupts from the gum.
- This process is called teething which can be quite painful.
- The wisdom teeth may never erupt or may erupt later in life.
- **transparent** /træn'spær.ənt/ adjective
If a substance or object is transparent, you can see through it very clearly:
Grow the bulbs in a transparent plastic box, so the children can see the roots growing.

translucent /trænz'lu:.sənt/ adjective OFTEN APPROVING
If an object or a substance is translucent, it is almost transparent, allowing some light through it:
translucent plastic/glass
This china is so fine and delicate that it's translucent.

opaque /əʊ'peɪk/ adjective
preventing light from travelling through, and therefore not transparent or translucent:
opaque glass/tights

- It is sensitive to touch and other stimuli.
stimulus → stimuli
- It's painful when dental decay reaches the pulp.

- It forms a thin layer on the root.
- ... the apical foramen where the blood vessels and nerves **enter the tooth...**

enter /'en.tər/ verb [I or T]

to come or go into a particular place:

The police entered the building through/by the side door.

You will begin to feel sleepy as the drug enters the bloodstream.
