Some useful words:

- **swell** /swel/ past tense **swelled**, past participle **swollen** [intransitive] also **swell up**
to become larger and rounder than normal - used especially about parts of the body:
Her ankle was already starting to swell.
- **post-mortem** /,p ost,m :t m.ig,z m.ɪ'nei.ʃ n/ [countable]
also **post mortem examin'ation**
an examination of a dead body to discover why the person died [= autopsy]
A post-mortem on the body revealed that the victim had been strangled.
do/carry out/conduct a post-mortem

conscious sedation

- **conscious** /'k n.ʃ s/
awake and able to understand what is happening around you [≠ unconscious]:
The driver was still conscious when the ambulance arrived.

Nitrous 'oxide produces a degree of pharmaco'logical sedation and should be 'supplemented and reinforced with psycho'logical reassurance.

- /,naɪ.tres' k.said/

☑ The antemortem and postmortem data are clearly inconsistent. The information is insufficient to form the basis for a conclusion.

- inconsistent /,ɪn.kən'sɪs.tənt/
- insufficient /,ɪn.sə'fɪʃ.ənt/
- basis /'beɪ.sɪs/

☑ For adults the method is highly variable.

- method /'meθəd/
- variable /'væ.rɪ.əb.əl/
